About the Song

“We Are Many” was written by Katie Eckeberger in response to an unprecedented surge of ICE enforcement in the Twin Cities, a deployment that has sparked national outrage and mobilization following the fatal shooting of Renée Nicole Good by an ICE agent in Minneapolis on January 7, 2026. In Minnesota, singing has become a powerful way for communities to come together to protect one another, build courage, and strengthen collective solidarity in the face of targeted immigration operations and rising resistance.

This song was shared with the Songs in the Key of Resistance Collective by Minneapolis song leader Liz Digitale Anderson. It is a testament to how cultural work and community care are interwoven in the struggle for justice and freedom.
